



Duty of Care Procedure for NIGHTSTOP

If a young person does not come home when expected try to contact them via phone, text, friends etc. making a note each time.

If you have been unable to make contact within an hour of when you expected them then use the following flowchart...



Call the young person's Social Services out of hours number to inform them of the situation:

YOU DO NOT NEED TO INFORM THE POLICE UNLESS ASKED TO DO SO BY SOCIAL SERVICES

Please keep a log of name/date/time calls are made and the name of the person you spoke to, so we can add this to the young person's records

If the young person is over 18, unless they have specific vulnerabilities it is unlikely EDT will take action, but they can provide guidance.

If social services are aware and you have followed the duty of care, you can text our OOH number but do not need to call.

If it is an emergency,
